

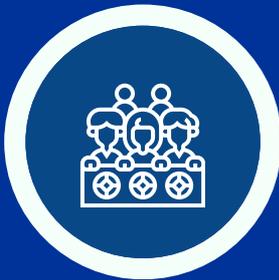


ACCREDITED OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS (OHSMS) CERTIFICATION

Occupational Health & Safety Management Systems certification is given by Certification Bodies to organizations that have demonstrated the implementation of a system for occupational health and safety.

ISO 45001 AT A GLANCE

OHSMS is a framework that enables an organization to regularly identify and regulate its health and safety risks, minimize the likelihood of accidents, assist in achieving compliance with health and safety legislation, and continuously improve its performance.



PURPOSE

- Specifies requirements for an Occupational Health and Safety Management System.
- Applicable to all organizations.



FOCUS AREAS

- Preventing injury and ill-health.
- Integrates worker wellness.



ISO 45001 DOES NOT

- Specify performance criteria or designs.
- Cover product safety, unless a risk to workers.

ACCREDITATION OF OHSMS CERTIFICATION BODY

Accreditation is the independent evaluation of certification bodies against ISO/IEC 17021-1, ISO/IEC 17021-10, and applicable IAF Mandatory Documents. These accreditation criteria set out the principles and requirements for the competence, consistency, and impartiality of bodies providing audit and certification of occupational health and safety management system services.

Accreditation provides confidence that a Certification Body for Occupational Health and Safety Management System (OHSMS) is competent to certify organizations and undertake its work impartially.
