## Fish Processing Training Benefits ...

The establishment of fish processing project in the Municipality of Sta. Catalina is a joint project among the DTI, DSWD and LGU Sta. Catalina to provide alternative source of livelihood for the 4Ps beneficiaries in the area. DTI provided fish processing tools and equipment under the Shared Service Facility (SSF) Program while the DSWD provided starter kit including packaging and labelling materials to enable the 4Ps beneficiaries start a fish processing venture. The LGU Sta. Catalina provided a building to house the facilities.
