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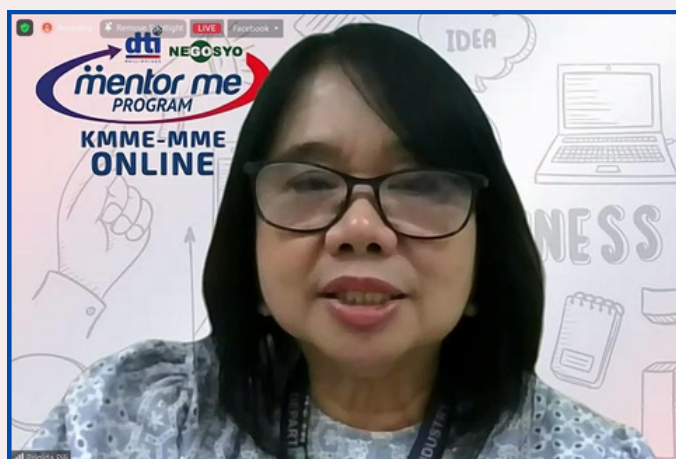
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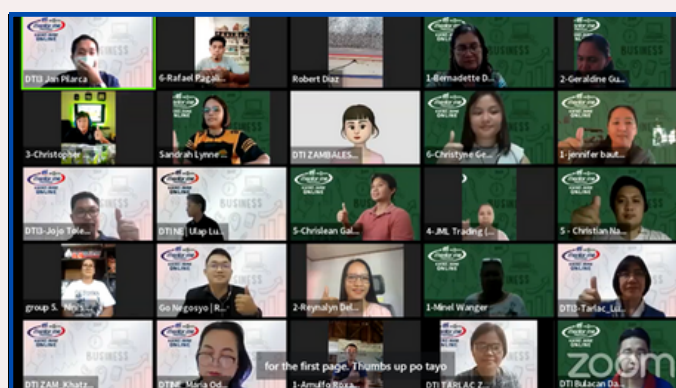

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The mentees, coming from different sectors, will undergo 10 online modules, coaching sessions, and will present their business improvement plans as their final presentation. Experts from the Philippine Center for Entrepreneurship (PCE), outstanding representatives from the government, banking and financial sector and online market platforms will serve as mentors and panel for the entire course.

PCE-Go Negosyo Mentor-Coordinator Armando "Butz" Bartolome gave a special message during the launching. He congratulated the new mentees and advised them to persevere and focus on the modules and activities. "Push on as mentees and when you become mentors, please don't forget to also help others," he added.

The KMME program aims to empower MSMEs (Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises) through mentorship and e-learning sessions. The sessions allow mentees to learn strategies on marketing, financial, human resources, and operations management, among others. With it, MSMEs are continuously kept abreast of innovative information, skills, and knowledge needed to scale up their businesses.

In her message, DTI Undersecretary Blesila A. Lantayona said that a graduate of KMME-MME program will surely benefit not only from the technical modules provided by the mentors but also from the vast network of enablers coming from the government sector.

For her part, DTI-3 OIC Regional Director Brigida T. Pili welcomed the participants and mentors through Zoom. "Upon completion of this online business course, you will become agents of change yourselves which will help bring to our country positive economic transformations," she said.

On August, the second batch of KMME mentees will undergo the same rudiments of the program.

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The Balikatan Enhanced Defense Cooperation Agreement (EDCA) is an annual exercise between the Armed Forces of the Philippines and the U.S. military designed to strengthen bilateral inter-operability, capabilities, trust, and cooperation built over decades of shared experiences.

In collaboration with the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Aurora Provincial Office, APECO invited the MSMEs of the province to set up booths of local products to be offered to U.S. soldiers.

“One of the objectives of the Balikatan Bazaar 2023, is the implementation of Kadiwa ng Pangulo para sa mga Mangagawa (KPM) and to give income opportunity for the marginalized sector thru selling of local produce and giving the U.S contingents the taste of Aurora food and cultural heritage”, APECO Community Relations Chief Luzed Anne Juanchon-Jandoc said.

Seventeen selected MSMEs have participated and catered to more than 200 U.S. soldiers, generating a total sales of Php 195,805.00. Some sold products were Balikatan shirts, wooden coasters, and souvenir items such as keychains, coin purses, ref magnets, and other wooden products.

DTI Aurora Provincial Director, Aldrin Veneracion has also visited and supported the event exhibitors. The MSMEs were very grateful for the event as they could sell and promote their products.

They also expect the event to be repeated in the future.

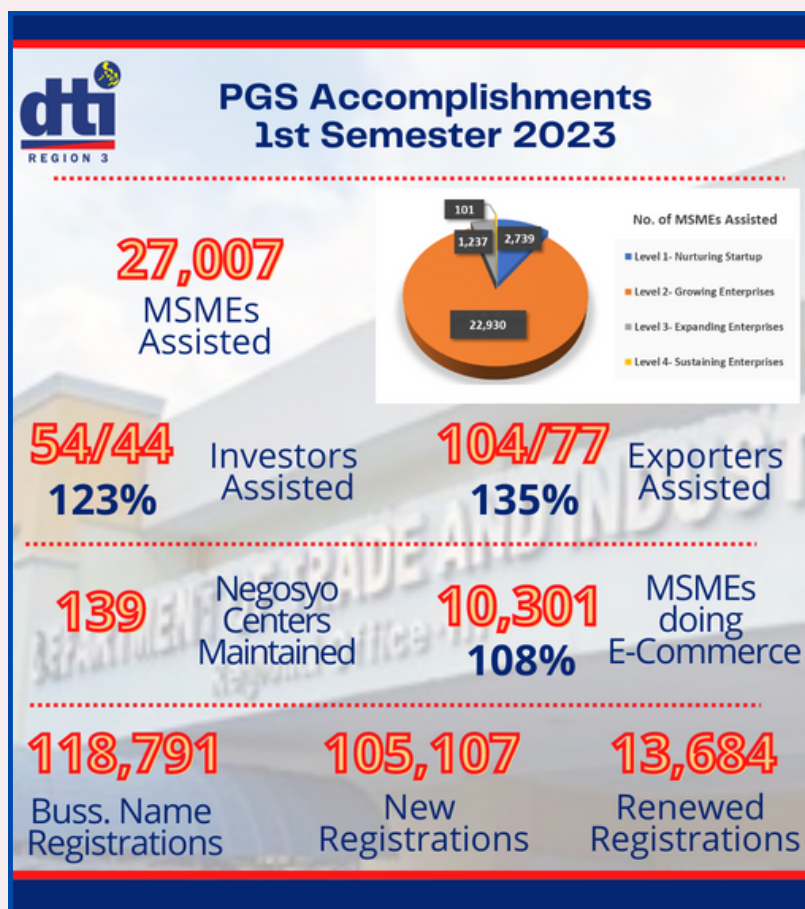
DTI-3 1st Semester Accomplishments

DTI Region 3 records remarkable achievements in assisting MSMEs and protecting consumers in the 1st Semester of 2023.

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Region 3 has demonstrated its unwavering commitment to supporting Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) and ensuring consumer protection during the 1st semester of 2023. The region has achieved remarkable milestones in various areas, reflecting the agency's dedication to fostering economic growth and enhancing consumer welfare.

For the 1st semester of 2023, the DTI Region 3 has successfully assisted an impressive total of 27,007 MSMEs. This significant support enables these enterprises to thrive, contributing to the region's economic sustainability and development. Investor assistance has also been notable, with 54 investors being guided and supported by DTI, surpassing the initial target of 44 with a remarkable 123% rate. The same applies to exporters, as 104 exporters were assisted, exceeding the target of 77 by 135%.



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DTI-3 1st Semester Accomplishments



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Maintaining 139 Negosyo Centers has been crucial in providing entrepreneurs with accessible and valuable services. The centers have assisted 68,002 clients, equipping them with the necessary knowledge and resources for their business endeavors. Additionally, 10,301 MSMEs have embraced e-commerce opportunities, exceeding expectations with a 108% rate of adoption.

The KMME Program, known for its success in mentoring MSMEs, has produced 48 new graduates, further expanding the network of successful entrepreneurs committed to scaling their businesses.

In the realm of consumer protection, DTI-3 conducted an impressive 259 monitoring activities on 1,077 establishments, achieving a 100% compliance rate. This ensures that consumers are protected from unscrupulous practices and have access to quality products and services.

Business name registration has been on the rise, with a total of 118,791 registrations, including 105,107 new registrations and 13,684 renewals. This reflects the entrepreneurial spirit in the region, with an increasing number of businesses formalizing their operations.

DTI Region 3 has also actively promoted MSMEs through trade fairs, resulting in sales totaling 20.194 Million pesos from 63 trade fairs organized or participated in. The agency has also organized 13 successful diskwento caravans, generating sales of 15.581 million pesos, providing consumers with access to affordable products.

Efforts in consumer complaints resolution and mediation have been commendable, with 388 complaints resolved or mediated, achieving a 100% resolution rate. Face-to-face and virtual mediations have been effectively utilized, ensuring consumer satisfaction.

Client satisfaction ratings speak volumes about the quality of DTI Region 3's services, with an outstanding 99.33% very satisfied rate, garnered from an impressive 98.52% retrieval rate.

These accomplishments are a testament to the hard work, dedication, and professionalism of the DTI Region 3 team, showcasing their commitment to the growth of MSMEs and consumer protection in the region. With such robust achievements, the region is poised for further progress and success in the second half of 2023.

More than 500 participants coming from the different provinces and sectors joined thru Zoom and Facebook livestream.

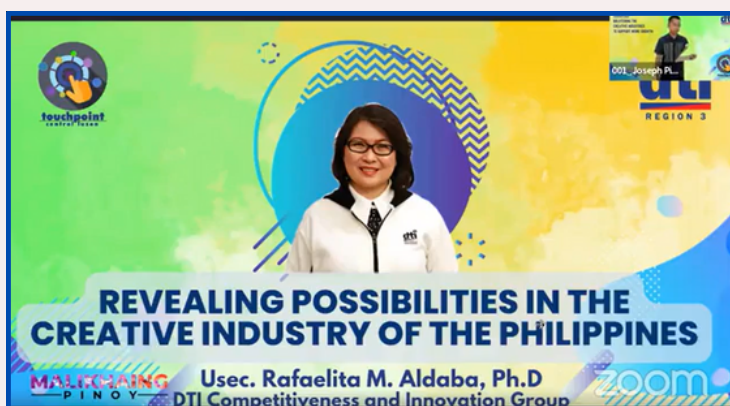

CPD holds webinar on RA 11900, IRR

The Department of Trade and Industry Region 3, thru its Consumer Protection Division, held a Webinar on RA 11900 or The Vaporized Nicotine and Non-nicotine Products Regulation Act and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) last May 24, 2023, via Zoom platform.

One hundred fifty-eight (158) participants, which are composed of stakeholders from the vape industry, and DTI monitors and enforcers from all the provinces of Region 3 attended the session.

RA 11900 lapsed into law on 25 July 2022 while its IRR, issued by DTI as the lead implementing agency, has been effective since last December 28, 2022. The law seeks to regulate importation, manufacturing, selling, packaging, distribution, use and communication of vapor products/refills, vapor product

devices, heated tobacco products (HTP), HTP consumables and devices, as well as novel tobacco products.

Mr. R.A. Aragones from the Consumer Policy Advocacy Bureau (CPAB) presented the salient features of the law. Included in his presentation are; products covered by the law, requirements for health warnings, fiscal markings, tamper resistant and child-resistant designs, sale of products, restrictions on product communications, advertisements and sponsorships, prohibitions on the use in public places, standards for designated vaping areas, product registrations, immediate recall, ban, or seizure of products, and penalties for non-compliance.

ARD Edna Dizon, in her message, urged the participants to support and comply with the requirements of the law so as to avoid any legal implications that may hamper their business operations.

RIIC3-THRIVE CL and ARISE Plus Philippines Project Collaboration and Innovation for Startups

On June 14, 2023, "ARISE Plus Philippines Project Business Mission to the Philippines on Startups and Innovation: Roundtable Discussion with THRIVE Central Luzon RIIC" was held at the College of Nursing AVR, Pimentel Building of the Bulacan State University (BulSU) in the City of Malolos, Bulacan. The hybrid Roundtable Discussion with THRIVE Central Luzon RIIC was attended by representatives from Central Luzon SUCs, HEIs and Technology Business Incubators from Region 3. It intends to get insights from the stakeholders on how the government, the industry, and the academe can collaborate to address critical gaps that hinder priority industries' contribution in the global value chain. It aims to explore how Regional Innovation Ecosystems work and how grassroots innovations are being supported.

ARISE Plus Project Associate Program Manager Mayara Louzada Alarcao Sobral and Mr. Miguel Alino Lopez, National Youth Expert, presented the objectives and background of ARISE in fostering inclusive economic growth and poverty reduction in the Philippines by enhancing the country's trade performance and competitiveness, through linkages with the EU industry, and targeted support to address the gaps, especially concerning

inclusive innovation and the entrepreneurship ecosystem.

The status of the Philippine Startup & Innovation Ecosystem in the country was presented by Mr. Karl Lyndon Pacolor, Division Chief of the Competitiveness Bureau of the Department of Trade and Industry, which is the lead partner in the International Trade Centre. OIC-Regional Director Brigida T. Pili of DTI Region 3, shared her insights on the importance of

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collaboration among stakeholders including the government, the academe, industry sectors in enhancing the competitiveness of MSMEs through Startups and inclusive innovation. The DTI's Shared Service Facilities, including BulSU's Food Processing and Food Testing Laboratory, which was formally turned-over earlier on the same day, is one of DTI's projects for startups and for innovation to improve the productivity and quality of products and services. Through this SSF, more products were already developed and are expected to be developed for commercialization, with continuous research and innovation to ensure global competitiveness.

In addition, capacity building activities for MSMEs and the Youth Entrepreneurs were also implemented by DTI. Moreover, OIC-ARD Edna D. Dizon, Concurrent Provincial Director of DTI Bulacan, clarified if there are existing projects in Central Luzon, but it was noted that this is the first activity outside Metro Manila. She emphasized the importance of funding in providing support to Startups and innovation projects.

The representatives of SUCs and HEIs also

DTI Zambales Consumer Protection Division together with the Local Price Coordinating Council (LPCC) members – Mayor's Office, Market Administration Office, Municipal Agriculture Office, Philippine National Police, Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO) and different Consumer Groups spearheaded the conduct of "Ikot-Palengke" in different municipalities of Zambales and in Olongapo City. For the second quarter of 2023, the team conducted total of 19 market visits, monitored 2,581 stalls, confiscated 92 defective weighing scales and registered 160 unregistered weighing scales on the spot.

Strategic market monitoring seeks to address the issues of profiteering, hoarding, and other artificial shortages that affect prices. It also aims to ensure the availability of other alternative products to BNPCs in the event of a supply shortage.

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Region 3, led by OIC- Regional Director Brigida T. Pili, together with OIC -Assistant Regional Director Edna D. Dizon, turned over the Shared Service Facility (SSF) equipment to Bulacan State University (BulSU) on June 14, 2023 at the College of Nursing AVR, Pimentel Hall, City of Malolos, Bulacan.

The Shared Service Facilities (SSF) Project is a flagship project of the DTI that aims to improve MSME productivity and efficiency through better access to technology. The SSF project is meant to improve MSME competitiveness by providing machinery, equipment, tools, systems, accessories, and other auxiliary items, skills, and knowledge under a shared system. The project is a public-private partnership initiative being implemented through cooperators who can house the machinery and equipment and make these accessible to MSMEs. The equipment will remain under the ownership of DTI until the end of the agreement and will be donated to the cooperator or the beneficiaries that have proven that they can sustainably manage and operate the facility in accordance with the objectives of the project.

The SSF project on Food Processing and Food Testing Laboratory was launched in 2016 to assist micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in their need for research, product improvement, and laboratory analysis.

The said SSF project is the 218th project donated to qualified cooperators in Central Luzon. The SSF equipment worth Php2,217,012 includes 5 types of machines namely: vacuum sealer, oven, foot sealer, High-Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC), and Fat Extraction System.

Director Pili gave a brief background of the SSF Project and the updates on the SSF bill, and expressed her hopes for more developmental and innovative projects involving the SSF.

University President, Dr. Cecilia S. Navasero-Gascon, as the cooperator, delivered a message of acceptance and gratitude for the donation of the SSF equipment to BulSU. She said that BulSU pledges to be a good steward of the equipment and vows to maximize the use of the facility.

Moreover, Assistant Regional Director Dizon congratulated BulSU for the SSF donation and expressed her hopes to see more gains thru serving not only MSMEs in Bulacan but also MSMEs in Central Luzon. She also encouraged BulSU to create more activities to highlight the products to be adopted by MSMEs.

DTI, LGU, PNP, and TCCI inspect weighing scales in Capas, Tarlac

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) – Tarlac, together with the Local Price Coordinating Council (LPCC) and Public Order and Safety Management Office (POSMO) of the Local Government Unit of Capas (LGU-Capas), Philippine National Police (PNP), and Tarlac Consumers Council Incorporated (TCCI), conducted a saturation drive at Capas Public Market on April 18, 2023.

“The inspection of weighing scales is conducted regularly in the public markets to ensure that consumers are protected from fraudulent vendors,” Trade-Industry Development Specialist Wessa Dizon said.

Out of the 68 analog and digital weighing scales inspected, 6 were found to be defective. They were confiscated and turned over to the LGU.

“The misrepresentation of the true weight and measure of goods sold is punishable by law under the Consumer Act of the Philippines or RA 7394,” Dizon said.

Likewise, a briefing on Label Law was conducted for the vendors to be aware of proper labeling and fair packaging of consumer products. DTI seeks to ensure that consumers get their money's worth in their purchases.

DTI Tarlac capacitates traders on BIGI standards

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) – Tarlac conducted a seminar about the Philippine National Standards on Black Iron and Galvanized Iron (BIGI) Steel Pipes on June 27, 2023, to capacitate and refresh distributors and retailers of the said products in the province.

The resource speakers, Engr. John Erick Ramirez and Engr. Andrea Mikhaela Lazarte from the Bureau of Product Standards (BPS) talked about the overview and function of BPS and the implementing guidelines and applicable Department Administrative Orders on BIGI steel pipes and tubes respectively.

Meanwhile, Engr. Pat Santos, Senior Technical Officer of the Philippine Association of Black Iron and Galvanized Iron Steel Pipes and Tubes Manufacturers Inc., explained the manufacturing process and discussed the marking requirements of the products.

OIC Provincial Director Florencia Balilo emphasized that the main thrust for holding seminars such as this is to ensure both consumer and supplier protection. “We encourage construction material retailers to comply with the corresponding regulations to guarantee product quality and safety,” she said.

A total of 48 owners and representatives of hardware and construction supply stores attended the activity.

For two consecutive months in the 2nd quarter of the year, DTI Nueva Ecija facilitated Diskwento Caravans in the LGUs of Bongabon and Carranglan on April and May, respectively. The former was conducted as one of the highlights of the celebration of the Sibuyas (Onion) Festival on April 1-2, 2023 at the municipal trading post, Curva, Bongabon while the latter was highlighted during the Gintong Butil Festival on May 11-12, 2023 at the Pag-asa Gym, Poblacion, Carranglan.

Both Diskwento Caravan were graced with the presence of the DTI3 OIC-Regional Director, Brigida Pili, Provincial Director Richard Simangan, Consumer Protection and Business Development Division team and the LGUs' key officials. A total of 56 wholesalers, distributors, retailers and local manufacturers exhibited during the caravan with 22 and 34, respectively. The number of households benefitted on these two caravans total to 2,476. The activity generated total sales of P1.238M for the following breakdown, Bongabon with P589M and Carranglan with P649.3M.

The activity primarily aims to improve consumers' access to basic and prime commodities through the mobilization of manufacturers/retailers selling basic food and non-food consumer items at a considerable discount. Also, it provides manufacturers the opportunity to exercise their corporate social responsibility and return the goodwill to the consuming public.

Generally, conduct of the Diskwento Caravan was a success mainly because of the support and cooperation and close coordination between DTI and the Local Government Units. It is recommended that similar activity be held / conducted in areas without supermarkets and big grocery stores which would mean more opportunities for local buyers/ consumers to access cheaper and discounted prices of basic and prime commodities and other household products.

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Bulacan Provincial Office thru its DTI-Shared Service Facility (SSF) Program has donated cacao processing equipment to Talbak Fruits and Coffee Growers Association Inc. (TFCGAI), an SSF co-operator, last June 5, 2023 at Talbak, Doña Remedios Trinidad, Bulacan.

SSF Project is meant to improve MSME competitiveness by providing machinery, equipment, tools, systems, accessories, and other auxiliary items, skills, and knowledge under a shared system. Thru this project DTI identified TFCGAI, an association of fruits and coffee farmers in the town of Doña Remedios Trinidad Bulacan with over one hundred (100) farmer members to be its co-operator of the project. The group has been a recipient of DTI interventions to help the association address the gaps in processing and marketing its cacao and coffee products since cacao and coffee is under the priority industry cluster of the department.

In the year 2021, DTI launched its very first SSF on cacao processing in the Province of Bulacan through TFCGAI. Equipment such as; winnower machine, cacao mellanger, multi-commodity solar dryer, moisture meter, industrial platform weighing scale and stainless working tables were given to the group in order for them to increase the productivity and address the processing equipment needs of cacao farmers, processors and stakeholders in the area and neighboring towns of Dona Remedios Trinidad.

In support to the SSF project in TFCGAI, DTI also gave package of marketing assistance such as promo collaterals through lighted promotional and directional signages, participation to trade fairs such as CARP regional trade fair and Likha ng Central Luzon, packaging and label development, provision of printed double wall insulated cups with lid and collapsible barista tables.

DTI will continue to monitor the progress of the SSF project whlie TFCGAI has agreed to continue the SSF project for the Bulakenyo Cacao processors.

DTI-N.E. HOLDS SEMINAR ON STEEL PIPES

The first resource speaker, Engr. Andrea Mikhaela Lazarte from the Standards Conformity Division of the Bureau of Philippine Standards (BPS) briefed the participants on BPS' mandate and functions. She also presented the new Philippine National Standards and Technical Regulations on steel pipes.

The second speaker, Engr. Patrocino Santos, the Vice-President of the Philippine Association of Black Iron and Galvanized Iron Pipes and Tubes Manufacturers, Inc., presented and discussed the common practices and problems in selling BI-GI steel pipes products. He also gave tips on how to prevent the acquisition of violative BI-GI steel pipes in the local market. In parting, he gave updates on the steel pipes industry.

The seminar was conducted with the aim of educating the participants on understanding the two new standards for steel pipes based on the approved PNS 26:2018 and PNS 2145:2020, differentiating safe and quality steel pipes versus substandard ones, hot-dipped galvanized iron steel pipes against pre-galvanized iron steel pipes and identifying approved markings, threading and color coding of steel pipes in accordance with the approved standards.

Generally, the seminar was a success mainly because of the overwhelming response of the hardware store owners as gleaned from the number of attendees coming from different cities and municipalities in the province. It is recommended that similar activity be conducted regularly to discuss other products covered under DTI mandatory certification scheme.

Starting 2017, the program kicked off gracefully and it was named OTOP Next Generation or simply OTOP NG. Basically, OTOP NG aims to dress up products with market potentials and to prepare them to places they will go.

Nueva Ecija's OTOP Industry Partners

The MSMEs have always been the main beneficiaries of the OTOP NG. With the capability building enhancements that DTI give them, they become empowered MSMEs. In spite of the financial challenges DTI is experiencing for the year, still, it has managed to hold various trade fairs.

The key to the successful staging of trade fairs can be attributed to these MSMEs who have levelled up, and became DTI's industry partners. The participants to the trade fairs no longer rely on DTI for subsidy for participation fees.

DTI Nueva Ecija's trade fairs

For the second quarter of 2023, DTI Nueva Ecija have successfully conducted 10 trade fairs versus the target of 3. Four (4) of which are OTOP Trade Fairs in partnership with Waltermart Cabanatuan City, San Jose City, Talavera and Gapan City. The 2 OTOP Trade Fairs in San Jose City and Cabanatuan City featured BIDA MSMEs account managed by Business Counsellors of Negosyo Centers. These BIDA MSMEs are also enrolled under the OTOP Next Gen Program. As DTI's partner, Waltermart provided the venue for these 4 OTOP Trade Fairs for free and as part of their corporate social responsibility (CSR) in support of DTI's OTOP.

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For the month of April, sales generated from trade fairs amounted to P766,631.00 versus the target of P690,000.00. For May, sales generated amounted to P1,241,335.00 versus a target of P1,120,000.00. For the 2nd quarter alone, DTI Nueva Ecija already generated total sales of P2,007,966.00 from trade fairs alone. A total of 111 OTOP MSMEs participated in all these trade fairs.

The Goodness in every trade fair

The challenge of limited budget has been successfully overcome with the support of the MSMEs as they invest in their participation to these trade fairs.

The trade fairs have also become a good venue for the participating MSMEs to network with one another by selling products with each other. Competition has become friendly as the MSMEs now carry each other's products to boost sales and promote other OTOP Products.

A "salo-salo" during egress also serves as an opportunity for the MSMEs to bond with one another and as a way of thanksgiving during the last day of the trade fair. Camaraderie and "bayanihan" is also evident during egress.



Way Forward

For the rest of the year, DTI Nueva Ecija will still stage several trade fairs. Some of the trade fairs the Nueva Ecija entrepreneurs will be participating in would be the 25th Likhang Central Luzon Regional Trade Fair on October 25 to 29 at SM Megamall, the Taas Noo Novo Ecijano on August 31 to September 3, 2023 and the year end trade fairs in November and December.

In preparation for these upcoming events, an OTOP assessment, consultation and triage (ACT) is being done to come up with new products.
