#### Baler, Baliwag, Samal, among the Most Competitive LGUs in the Philippines

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), through its Competitiveness Bureau (CB), held the Philippine Creative Cities and Municipalities Competitiveness Congress on September 28, 2023, at the Fiesta Pavilion, Manila Hotel.

The event highlighted the recognition and awarding of local government units from all over the Philippines with exemplary performance and ranking in the top three of the five pillars of the Cities and Municipalities Competitiveness Index (CMCI) as categorized into the following classifications: 5th 6th Class to 3rd Class Municipalities, to 4th Municipalities, lst to 2nd Class Municipalities, Component Cities, and Highly Urbanized Cities (HUCs). Special awards were also given to the Most Improved Cities and Municipalities and the Most Competitive Province.

Since its inception in 2013, Central Luzon has consistently positioned a number of LGUs in the top ranks. For 2023, recognition was given to the following:

Baler, Aurora Class 3-4 Municipalities Category

2nd Overall Competitiveness

Baliwag, Bulacan Class 1-2 Municipalities Category 3rd Overall Competitiveness

CMCI is being administered in Central Luzon through the initiative of DTI-3 under the Industry Development Division, in cooperation with the seven DTI Provincial Offices and the participation of the region's 130 cities and municipalities. Nationwide, 1,634 cities and municipalities have provided their data for the CMCI.



#### Business Permits and Licensing Officers hold Regional Convention By: Nerson Ray F. Romero

The 4th Regional Convention of BPLOs in Region 3 gathered over 200 Business Permit and Licensing Officers (BPLOs) and Development Economic Local and Investment Promotion Officers (LEDIPOs) at the Royce Hotel in Clark, Pampanga, from July 6-7, 2023. Organized by the Central Luzon Association of BPLOs Inc. (CLAB) and supported by the Department of Trade and Industry Regional Office III (DTI-3), the convention emphasized the theme "Revolutionizing Business Permit Processes Digitalization," advocating Thru for technological adoption in business permit issuance.

DTI-3 OIC Regional Director Brigida T. Pili welcomed the delegates acknowledging the convention's significance and urging the integration of technology in permit issuance to streamline operations and eliminate bureaucratic hurdles.

Special consultant Mr. Crispin De Luna, representing Bulacan Governor Daniel R. Fernando, praised BPLOs and LEDIPOs for creating a business-friendly environment encouraging investment and sustainable growth.

Keynote speaker OIC Director Rachel Ann Grabador from the Government Digital Transformation Bureau highlighted the role of digitalization in enhancing ease of doing business. She introduced the eGovPH super app, a comprehensive platform for government transactions, urging delegates to leverage its features for diverse services. Engr. Antonio Edward Padre, DICT-3 Regional Director, shared the status of digitalization in Central Luzon LGUs, citing the Integrated Business Permit and Licensing System (iBPLS) in 79 LGUs, simplifying permit acquisition.

Philippine Statistics Office Region 3 Regional Director Arlene Divino discussed the standardization of business classification via the Philippine Standard Industrial Classification (PSIC), advocating its adoption for uniform data processing.

The second day featured Chief Superintendent Jesus Fernandez of the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), revealing the integration of the Fire Safety Inspection Certificate (FSIC) in the eGov app. This addition facilitates online application for FSIC, eliminating the need for physical visits.

Department of the Interior and Local Government Region 3 Assistant Regional Director Jay Timbreza highlighted the integration of Barangay Clearance in iBPLS, enabling online application in select LGUs.

The convention also witnessed the CLAB officers' oath-taking, officiated by ARD Timbreza. The gathering was an impactful exchange of ideas and strategies aimed at propelling digital transformation and enhancing business permit processes across Central Luzon's LGUs.


The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Region 3, in collaboration with the Social Welfare Department of and Development (DSWD) and the Deparmtment of Agriculture (DA) has successfuly awarded cash assistance to 2,923 qualified rice retailers in Central Luzon.

The cash assistance pegged at P15,000.00 was set in motion to help micro rice retailers selling regular- and well-milled rice following the issuance of Executive Order No. 39 which set ceiling prices for the said variety of rice. It is part of DSWD's Sustainable Livelihood Program - Economic Relief Subsidy (SLPaligns ERS). This initiative with the government's commitment to support micro rice retailers and ensure the availablity of affordable rice for consumers.

Nueva Ecija had the highest number of payees with 749 beneficiaries followed by Bataan with 563, and Zambales with 497. Meanwhile, Tarlac had 395 payees, Bulacan with 305, Pampanga with 216, and Aurora with 198 beneficiaries. "We aim for this payout to aid your businesses, to prevent losses, and to sustain your retailing businesses in public markets so that we can assist our consumers in purchasing affordable rice. This comes at a time when we are anticipating the rice harvest in our municipalities and barangays," DTI-3 OIC RD Pili said to the rice retailers in attendance



# DTI, BCCI launched Gabay-Negosyo Project

effort an to bolster entrepreneurship, In innovation, and sustainability among microentrepreneurs in the province of Bulacan, the Bulacan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BCCI) partnered with the Department of Trade and Industry-Bulacan (DTI-Bulacan) to launch the Gabay-Negosyo Project. This initiative aims to provide comprehensive assistance to local micro-entrepreneurs, equipping them with the necessary knowledge and skills to improve and expand their businesses. The project involves the collaboration of various stakeholders, including the academe, government agencies, and private benefitted organizations, and 28 microenterprises from across Bulacan's seven districts.

The Gabay-Negosyo Project kicked off on July 7, 2023, with a launch event held at Max's Restaurant Kapitolyo. This marked the beginning of a two-month journey for the participating micro-entrepreneurs.

The success of the project is largely attributed to the cooperation of several key partners. The Bulacan State University (BuLSU), Department of Science and Technology (DOST), Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT), Provincial Government of Provincial Cooperative Bulacan and Enterprise Development Office (PGB-PCEDO), and Small Business Corporation (SB Corp), all playing pivotal roles in providing expertise, guidance, mentorship, and one-on-one consultations to the micro-entrepreneurs.

#### Key Components of the Project

1. Entrepreneurial Mindsetting Seminar: The project commenced with a seminar focused on cultivating an entrepreneurial mindset among participants. This session aims to enhance their entrepreneurial competencies and technical abilities, preparing them to establish or expand their businesses. Furthermore, participants are encouraged to register their businesses with the DTI, ensuring legal compliance.

2. Financial Literacy: A financial literacy seminar equips participants with essential skills, such as personal financial management, budgeting, and investing. Additionally, a financing forum, in collaboration with PGB-PCEDO and SB Corp, was organized to present various government financing options available to micro, small, and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs).

3. Online Marketing and Data Security: To adapt to the digital age, micro-entrepreneurs received training on online marketing strategies. Topics included data security and privacy for MSMEs, as well as social media branding assessment, with resource persons from the DICT providing valuable insights.

4. Food Safety and Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP): A seminar on food safety and GMP was conducted to ensure product quality,, prevent contamination, and reduce the risk of foodborne illnesses.

5. FDA Registration Requirements and Packaging and Labeling: Participants were oriented on FDA registration and packaging and labeling requirements with essential knowledge and guidance regarding regulatory compliance.

6. Keeping Up with Design Trends: Wtih the ever-evolving business landscape, staying updated is crucial. A design consultant shared the latest trends in aesthetics, materials, colors, form, and functionality. The consultant drew inspiration from recent visits to trade fairs like Maison de Objet, Ambiente, Christmas World, and Creative World. The project not only provided knowledge and skills but also emphasized the importance of values like hard work, persistence, and integrity in business. BCCI trustees played mentoring role throughout the program, guiding participants on their entrepreneurial journey.

Twelve (12) out of the 28 beneficiaries had the opportunity to participate in the 2023 Bulacan Food Fair and Expo (BUFFEX) to gain experience in trade fairs. This exposure helped them attract new markets and increase their sales potential.

The Gabay-Negosyo Project concluded with a graduation ceremony held on September 6, 2023, during the DTI Day at BUFFEX. During this event, participants were not only recognized for their dedication but also received financial assistance to further grow their businesses.

The Gabay-Negosyo Project exemplifies the power of collaboration and targeted support in fostering entrepreneurship and sustainability among micro-entrepreneurs. Valenzuela, DTI SSF point persons, Paschal MPC Chairperson Maxima Salhay and the cooperative officers and members.

The SSF project of Paschal MPC is a meat processing facility launched in May 2021, during the height of the community quarantine implemented by the government. The donated equipment were: meat slicer, bone saw, meat stuffer, stainless working tables and freezer amounting to two hundered thirty thousand pesos. The counterpart of the cooperator in this project was construction of a processing facility and procurement of other cooking tools and food items.

Cooperator Paschal MPC is a multipurpose cooperative in the town of Pandi, Bulacan, whose primary product is savings and loans with over 50 members who are engaged in various livestock and poultry production. Among their initial products were tapa, skinless longganisa and tocino. They also added chicken nuggets, hotdogs and salami after the SSF was established.

Based on DTI's monitoring, through the submitted reports of the cooperator, the project can be considered a success, as determined by its measurable impacts such as: 150% increase in MSME beneficiaries, 300% increase in jobs generation and 72% increase in sales generation. Ms. Maxima Salhay, Chaiperson of Paschal MPC, is very thankful to DTI because of its intervention to their cooperative and they committed to continue the objectives of the Shared Service Facility that was donated to them. DTI will also continue to support the SSF program of Paschal MPC through their enrollment to more advanced programs to help them upsize their business to improve the lives of their members in the spirit of cooperativism.

#### DTI-Bulacan and Partners Spearhead Sustainable Solutions for Plastic Waste Management in Bocaue

On August 29, 2023, a Skills Training on Souvenir Items Making was held at the Multipurpose Hall in Batia, Bocaue. This activity aims to provide participants with valuable crafting skills, including resin casting, molding, and recycling techniques. These skills not only enhance their creative abilities but also open doors to potential income-generating opportunities.

On September 1, 2023, a stakeholders' meeting was convened with the support of LGU Bocaue through its Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO), DTI-Bulacan, Green Antz Builders, and BULSU College of Engineering. The meeting focused on the operationalization of the SSF facility for plastic waste conversion.

Transportation plays an essential part in the connectivity and efficient flow of goods in the supply chain. It is considered as the backbone of logistics in the ecosystem that creates impact on costs, efficiency, customer satisfaction, and overall business success.

The Department of Trade and Industry and the Toyota Motor Philippines (TMP), having a common vision in creating a sustainable business environment, partnered in the implementation of "KILOS KA-NEGOSYO" Program effective March 4, 2023. In support, the DTI-Bulacan Provincial Office identified the ten (10) MSMEs engaged in manufacturing, service and trading, who signified the willingness to respond and give inputs to the survey facilitated by UPLB. The culminating activity, a Focused Group Discussion on the Logistics Assessments with the stakeholders, was held on August 9, 2023 at the Eden Oasis Events and Banquet Hall in the City of Malolos, Bulacan, with the intention to validate and finalize the results of the survey. It was attended by the representatives of TMSP, DTI, UPLB and the respondents.

In summary, it was noted that MSMEs have different requirements that would suit the specific logistics needs. These would vary according to the type of products (food or non-food), the size of products, speed, capacity, power, fuel efficiency, after-sales services, as well as the procurement terms. These factors were all noted by TMSP for consideration in their planning.

Through Kilos Ka-Negosyo, TMP is expected to provide a more appropriate and viable support in MSMEs' accessibility that would increase business opportunities, value-chain expansion, and sustainable business operations.

# NC SAN LUIS HOLDS TRAINING ON Coco-sugar processing for IPS

SAN LUIS, AURORA – The Negosyo Center San Luis (NC SL) of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) – Aurora Provincial Office conducted a Skills Training on Coconut Sugar Processing for Indigenous People (IPs) in Barangay Diteki on July 22.

Thirty-three (33) Samahan ng mga Katutubong Altang Nagkakaisa (S.K.A.N) members attended the training.

Ma. Nelly Gianan, President of the Bianoan Coconut Upland Farmers Association (BCUFA), an existing producer of coconut sugar from Casiguran, Aurora, served as the trainer.

According to Gianan, coconut sugar production requires the crucial process of collecting the coconut sap.

"Kailangan talaga ng tyaga at disiplina sa pangongolekta ng tuba, dahil may oras na sinusunod at kailangan siguraduhing malinis" she added.

In preparation for the training, the coconut farmers had to extract and harvest the coconut sap from healthy, good-bearing palm trees. It took them three weeks to collect the right amount of coconut sap to be processed into sugar. The harvested sap was immediately boiled into coconut syrup to prevent fermentation. On the day of the training, the coconut syrup was boiled until it turned into granules.

Meanwhile, Jocelyn Callos, President of S.K.A.N, was impressed and appreciated the training since coconut sugar has much commercial potential, and customers increasingly seek regular table sugar replacements.

"Kaya po pala mahal ang coconut sugar dahil napaka sensitibo po pala ng paggawa nito. Nagpapasalamat po kami sa pagtitiyaga ng DTI na maituro ito sa amin", Callos said.

Furthermore, NC San Luis Business Counselor Florelyn Caniete conducted an entrepreneurship awareness seminar and provided the participants with DTI Programs and Services Orientation.

The activity also includes providing a new logo for the association, product labels, and packaging for the training outputs.

As Ms. Butardo, ended her discussion, she encouraged the SSF Cooperators and MSMEs to join in innovating the design of their products to a more sustainable direction.

The DTI Nueva Ecija, in partnership with the BPS and BI-GI Manufacturers Association, organized the Seminar on Steel Pipes on July 4, 2023 at the Plaza Leticia Restaurant, Cabanatuan City for the 72 hardware store owners and representatives.

The first resource speaker, Engr. Andrea Mikhaela Lazarte from the Standards Conformity Division of the Bureau of Philippine Standards (BPS) briefed the participants on BPS' mandate and functions. She also presented the new Philippine National Standards (PNS) and Technical Regulations on steel pipes.

The second speaker, Engr. Patrocino Santos the Vice-President of the Philippine Association of Black Iron and Galvanized Iron **Pipes** Tubes and Manufacturers. Inc. presented and discussed the common practices and problems in selling BI and GI steel pipes products.



He also gave tips on how to prevent the acquisition of violative BI-GI steel pipes in the local market. In parting, he gave updates on the steel pipes industry.

The seminar was conducted with the aim of educating the participants on understanding the two new standards for steel pipes based on the approved PNS 26:2018 and PNS 2145:2020, differentiating safe and quality steel pipes versus substandard ones, hot-dipped galvanized iron steel pipes against pre-galvanized iron steel pipes and identifying approved markings, threading and color coding of steel pipes in accordance with the approved standards.

The success of the seminar can be attributed mainly because of the overwhelming response of the hardware store owners as gleaned from the number of attendees coming from different cities / municipalities in the province. It is recommended that similar activity be held/conducted regularly to discuss other products covered under DTI mandatory certification scheme.

Balanga City - About 558 micro rice retailers and sari-sari store owners in Bataan received P15,000 each with a total amount of P 8,370,000.00 from the Department of Social Welfare and Development and the Department of Trade and Industry during the payouts at the Ground Floor, The Bunker Building, Capitol Compound, Balanga City and Vistamall, Balanga City, Bataan on August 12 and September 28, 2023, respectively.

The aid, under the Sustainable Livelihood Program-Cash Assistance for Micro Rice Retailers is given by DSWD to rice retailers who suffered losses due to the mandated price cap of P41 per kilo for regular milled rice and P45 a kilo for well-milled rice. They incurred losses as they purchased their rice supplies at higher prices before the implementation of iExecutive Order No. 39 issued by President Ferdinand Marcos, Jr.

DTI-Bataan Provincial Director Eileen Ocampo certified and listed the beneficiaries as qualified rice retailers and sari-sari stores and compliant with said Executive Order. The Director advised the beneficiaries to adhere to the rice price ceiling which is in effect nationwide.

They are also engaged in community building initiatives such as the reforestation program for Pantabangan and Carranglan Watershed Forest Reserve where about 70 jobs were generated as worker and planters, mos of whom are Indigenous People.

With all these, it is an undeniable fact that Bambuhay, which is being assisted by DTI-NE, is producing a world class and globally competitive, sustainable and ecofriendly products. Bambuhay is now generating more jobs for the harvester of bamboo poles who were previous illegal logger, slash and burn farmers, and former rebels. In addition to that, it generates more jobs in the production that gives opportunity to the marginalized communities like PWDs, Indigenous People, Farmers, Solo Parents, and Out-Of-School Youth.

On June 30, 2023, the Founder Mark Sultan Gersava took his oath to President Bongbong Marcos as the youngest Executive Member of the National Innovation Council. This council serves as the Philippine government's highest policy-making body for national innovation development.

If they wear a Filipiniana with its unique modern version, most probably it was made by the careful hands of people behind LJRM. The Filipiana mania is getting contagious just like a happy smile when you feel confidently beautiful. Just looking at its various ensemble makes a person feel good. The Filipino native wear in Jusi or Pinya cloth is amazingly admirable, made by LJRM.

#### How did it happen?

As shared by Mr. Rundie Maniquiz, his previous work as a marketing staff in a fiber weaving company in Aklan was the beginning of his Filipiniana journey. He combined his work experience by taking up a fashion designing course and fabric development training. By: Maria Odessa R. Manzano Gerald Dennis S. Suyayen

Armed with inspiration and experience, he then started his own business in 2008. Sir Rundie, supplies originally designed woven fabrics to different fashion designers and manufacturing companies. In 2011, he started making his own ready to wear (RTW) products, barong and Filipiniana packaged in paper mache boxes to create a more elegant presentation. He then opened his first outlet at The Fort in Taguig City under the business name, Crafts Creation. In 2015, he expanded his business in his hometown Peñaranda, Nueva Ecija.

In 2017, he was approached by the DTI through its Negosyo Center in Gapan City. It was the start of the partnership between DTI and Crafts Creation. A series of assistance was given to Crafts Creation. The company was enrolled under the OTOP Next Generation and was provided with product development of which 15 prototypes were developed and showcased during the 2017 Likha ng Central Luzon Regional Trade Fair at the SM Megamall, Mandaluyong City. Also in 2017, Crafts Creation participated in the National Trade Fair and it generated the highest sales among Central Luzon exhibitors.

Through OTOP, the business name, Crafts Creation was made their brand name. In 2018, LJRM Enterprises became their lone and legitimate business name. Whenever there is a DTI-initiated trade fair, big or small, there is LJRM.

### A taste of resiliency with the flame of hope that never dies....

Prior to the Covid 19 pandemic, the company has 100 subcontracted employees and 45 regular employees. They supply to various department stores and concept shops until 2019. LJRM is also a Kapatid Mentor Me graduate of DTI-Nueva Ecija in 2018. However, due to the Covid19 pandemic, things took a different turn for the company and its workers.

The pandemic almost shut the company down. There were no events that would require the wearing of Filipiniana due to strict restrictions and quarantine protocols worldwide. Market demand stopped. Sir Rundie resorted to a way to survive and live even if it was difficult. They engaged in farming to have other means of income to feed their inhouse staff from outside of Nueva Ecija. It was really an extremely challenging predicament as no one knew when the Covid19 nightmare would end.

Another blow of trial hit LJRM when in September of 2021, the devastating Typhoon Karding hit Nueva Ecija. The roofing of their working area was hit by strong winds. A purchase order of boxes worth P200,000 was made and was totally damaged by heavy winds and rains. Nothing was savede except their resilience and hope.

#### After Covid, what?

They say that with downfalls there is no way but up. The gates of the economy is now open for business, including for LJRM. There was an enhanced fondness for the Filipiniana outfit after the pandemic as it was obviously felt. The people love to show off, as if saying, "Hey, we survived the pandemic and we are Filipinos". And also, the people love to dress up wholeheartedly after almost 3 long years of nothing but pure restrictions. Hence, opportunities are made in heaven for LJRM.

As of to date, the demand for their products continue. Their best sellers are the beautifully designed pieces. Small events in hotels in Central Luzon also give them opportunities to sell through side event trade fairs. The closure of many establishments engaged in barong and Filipinianamaking in other provinces like Bulacan gave other marketing opportunities for LJRM. They now serve as suppliers to these establishments so the latter can continue with their businesses.

LJRM slowly stands up with its effort to modernize production. The embroidery is made with computer aided device which gives them increased productivity and ease of doing the hard and delicate embroidery works. On the one side, the hand painted versions are maintained as this has a market niche.

With its modern facilities and newly renovated showroom in Peñaranda, it has 45 regular employees and 60 subcontractors working daily to make elegantly crafted Filipiniana outfits for men, women and children.
